# **VOLUNTEER JOB DESCRIPTIONS (4 PAGES)**

The following volunteer roles are available for individuals age 13-adult. An application process is required except where noted.

# **Donated Boat Assistant**

S.A.L.T.S. receives a substantial number of boats each year as donations. These boats are regularly cleaned and maintained as they await a purchaser, with the proceeds helping to fund programs aboard our two schooners. Keeping the donated boats clean and well maintained is essential to ensure that we sell them quickly and for the highest market value.

# **Responsibilities**

A person filling this volunteer role will be given responsibilities based on his/her skillset that will include some or all of the following:

- Clean interior and exterior of donated boats as directed by the Boat Sales Manager to prepare them for positive viewing and sales.
- Perform maintenance tasks on donated boats as directed by the Boat Sales Manager, such as: scraping, sanding, painting, oiling, plumbing, electrical, mechanical, rigging and other minor maintenance tasks.

# **Relationships**

The Donated Boat Assistant often works alone but is sometimes accompanied by other Donated Boat Assistants. This volunteer role reports directly to the Boat Sales Manager; in his absence, this role reports to the Boat Donation Program Manager. The supervisor will provide an orientation, ongoing coaching and performance feedback, encouragement and recognition.

# **Skills and Knowledge**

Ability to use cleaning products and tools as directed Follows through on assigned tasks Physical fitness, strength and stamina to work in an outdoor environment Mobility and balance to safely move around the dock and boats Uses materials and tools as directed Works efficiently with an awareness of timeframes If assisting with boat maintenance: Wood-working, mechanical and/or plumbing experience

### **Interpersonal Skills**

Ability to work well with other peers and supervisors Ability to relate to the public, potential customers, Society members, and business partners in a gracious and enthusiastic manner that represents S.A.L.T.S. positively

# **Personal Characteristics**

Highly self-motivated Strong sense of accountability for good stewardship of the Society's limited resources Attitude of service Teachable

# Workshop Assistant

The volunteer in this role works primarily at our shop at 451 David Street which is a ship maintenance and equipment storage facility. Our shop is usually only open on weekdays.

### **Responsibilities**

Tasks, projects, and errands related to the organization, upkeep, and operation of the S.A.L.T.S. workshop and maintenance of our Tall Ships.

## **Relationships**

This volunteer position reports to the Shop Foreman, but in his absence may be supervised by another volunteer, staff-member, or crew-member. The Shop Foreman will provide an orientation, ongoing coaching and performance feedback, encouragement and recognition.

# **Skills and Knowledge**

Willingness to work in a sometimes noisy workshop or ship environment Ability to adhere to safety practices Aptitude for working in an organized and tidy manner Knowledge of woodworking, metalwork, and wooden boat maintenance is an asset but is not required

## **Interpersonal Skills**

Follow directions and complete tasks to an acceptable standard Cooperate and work in harmony with others in working on projects

# **Personal Characteristics**

Self-motivated Responsible Capable of working with moderate supervision Displays a positive attitude of service

# Shore-side Bosun's Mate

S.A.L.T.S. mentors 1700 young people each year aboard two wooden schooners. This volunteer role assists in their maintenance, primarily working on board the ships while they are moored in Victoria's inner or upper harbour.

### **Responsibilities**

Tasks, projects, and errands related to the maintenance of our Tall Ships when they are in port, which is generally weekdays from November through February and weekends (Friday afternoon through Sunday) from March through October. The majority of the work will involve paint and bright-work. Other work may include assisting the Shop Foreman with rigging, woodwork, plumbing, and electrical work.

#### **Relationships**

This volunteer position reports to the Shop Foreman if working on weekends during the sailing season, and to a crew-member if working on week-days. The supervisor will provide an orientation, ongoing coaching and performance feedback, encouragement and recognition.

### **Skills and Knowledge**

Experience in refinishing woodwork and applying paint, oil and varnish would be an asset. Experience in wooden boat maintenance would be an asset. Aptitude for working in an organized and tidy manner Ability to adhere to safety practices

### **Interpersonal Skills**

Interact with the public in a courteous and helpful manner Cooperate and work in harmony with others in working on projects

Strong attention to detail Ability to work to a high standard with limited supervision Displays a positive attitude of service Self-motivated Responsible

# **Casual Volunteer Positions**

These volunteer roles do <u>not</u> require an application form to be completed in advance but volunteers must sign in each time they participate:

# Tall Ship Cleaning—Shortly After Ships Return to Port

At the end of each sailing voyage our tall ships need to be thoroughly cleaned, including mopping floors, removing garbage, cleaning the heads (bathrooms), and wiping down all surfaces with a solution of water and bleach. From early March to late June and again in September/October, most trips end on Friday afternoons. There are also a few summer trips that end in Victoria. Contact the SALTS office at 250.383.6811 or info@salts.ca to confirm our sailing schedule in advance, and then phone on the day you plan to volunteer in order to find out the estimated time of arrival (ETA) and location of our ships, as this varies from week to week. Please wear clothing that can get dirty or damaged.

We have a few special events each year where volunteers play a vital role. Roles may include serving as docents (tour guides) aboard our tall ships, working at our display, or greeting guests.
